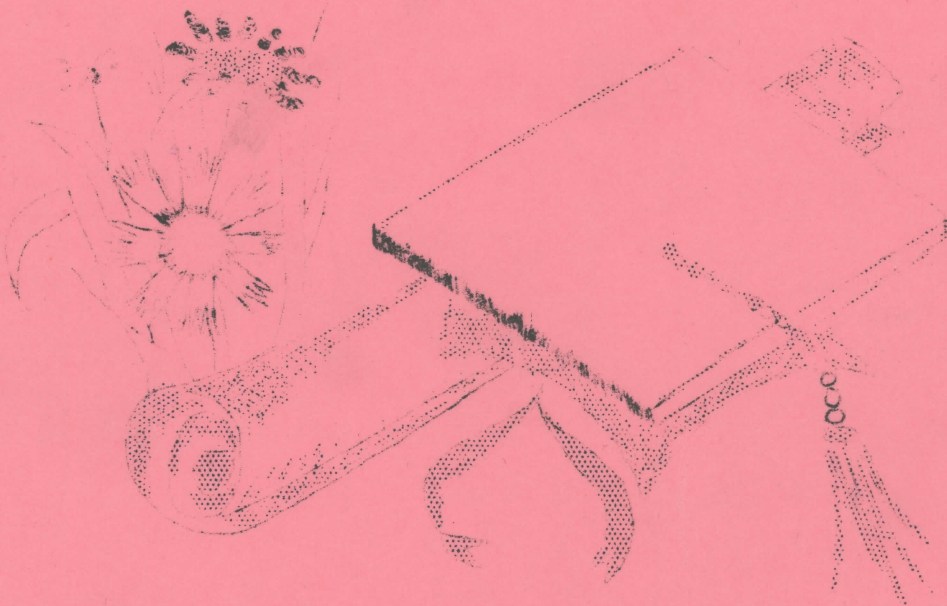

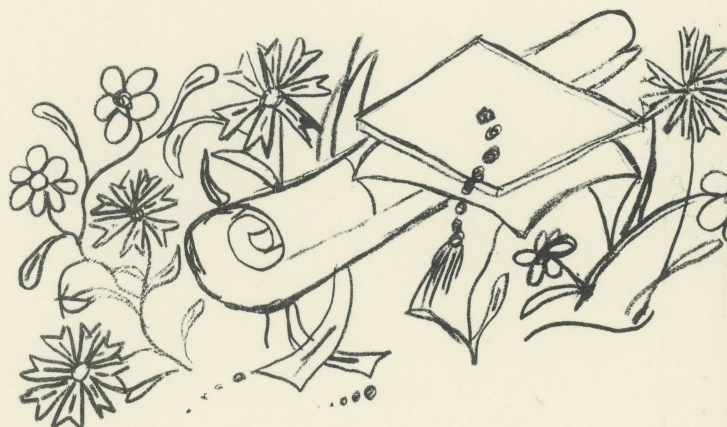

My name is Debbie Barlease I am a Northern Nevada Paiute Indian from Nixon, Nevada.

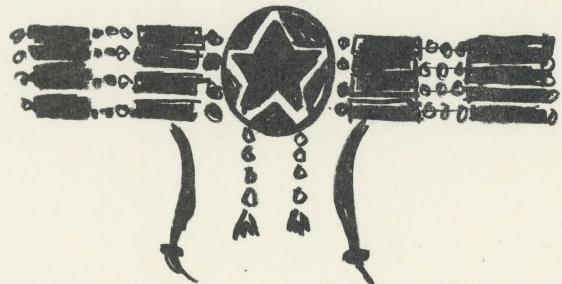

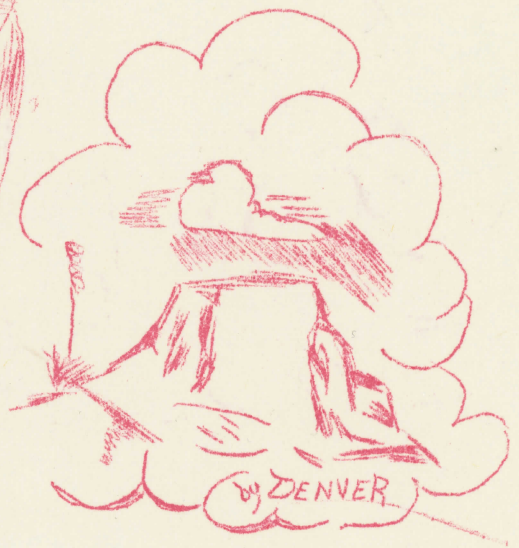
This is my last year in a high school and my last year at Stewart, I really like it here.

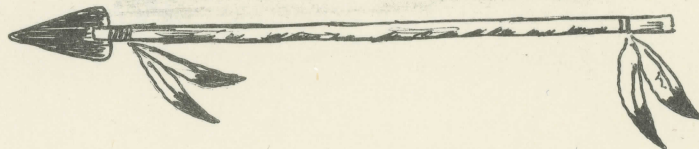
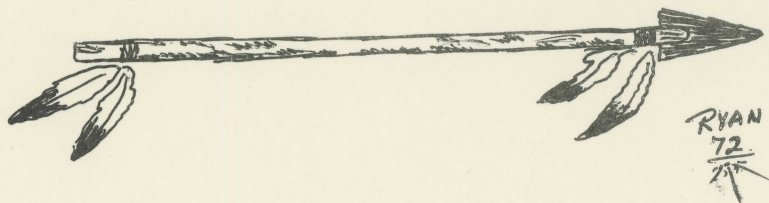
SIMON CARLOS

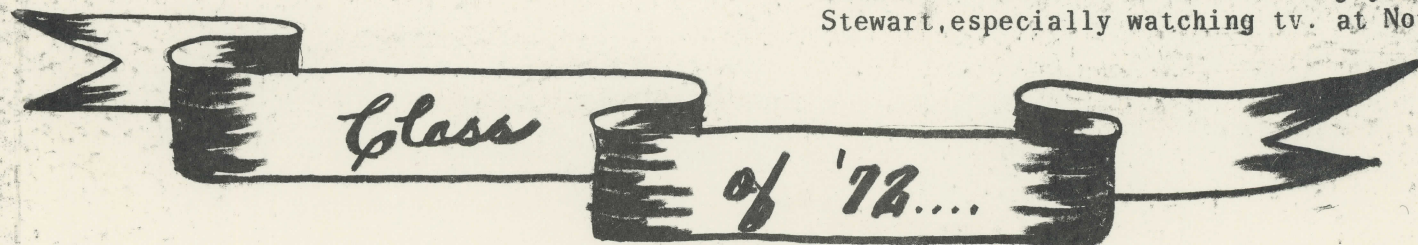

I plan to attend Haskell Jr. College this coming year. I'll be studying Dental technology.

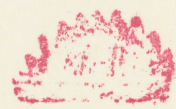
EVAN HARPER

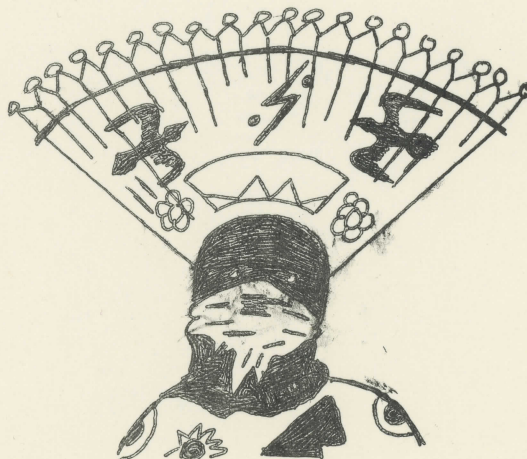
My plan after graduation is to go to S.I.P.E. down in Alburquerque and take up Electronics.

COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES, GUEST SPEAKER

Miss Wilma L. Victor, Special Assistant to the Secretary of the Interior on Indian Affairs will be the Commencement Speaker at Stewart Indian School on May 25, 1972 at 1:30 p.m. in the school Gymnasium.

Miss Victor is a full blooded Choctaw Indian, born in Idabel, Oklahoma, she is a three year Veteran of the U.S. Women's Army Corps, designated one of six Government Career Women to receive Federal Women's Award, 1967, and was awarded citation from the University of Oklahoma in 1969 comparable to an honorary degree, she was selected by the State of Utah as one of the Seven Women of the Seventies. She received the National Achievement Award of Indian Council Fire-December 1970. This award has been given annually to an outstanding Indian since 1933. To qualify for the award the recipient must attain a high degree of recognition in his chosen field and must have contributed constructively to the world in general.

She is a recipient of Indian of the Year Award for 1971 which was presented by the Anadarko Indian Exposition, Anadarko, Oklahoma, August 1971. She received the Distinguished Alumnus Award, May 1972, from the University of Wisconsin, Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Miss Victor has received her B.S. in Social Studies and School Administration, University of Wisconsin - 1941, Master of Education, School Administration and Curriculum, University of Oklahoma - 1953, and is currently working in a doctorate program, Utah State University.

She is associated with American Association of School Administrators, member of Committee on Technology and Instruction.

She has been in the Educational Field since 1969. She first taught in Secondary School in Idabel, Oklahoma. In 1949, she went to Intermountain School, Brigham City, Utah, where she was Principal, Education Specialist and Education Program Administrator.

She left Brigham City to become Principal at the Institute of American Indian Arts, Santa Fe, New Mexico. Since 1970 she has been Deputy Area Director, Phoenix Area Office.

She is now Special Assistant to the Secretary of the Interior on Indian Affairs, Washington, D.C.
